Summary: During the revision process stakeholders requested that certifications that may be used to verify compliance with criteria shall be listed. A first proposed listing is presented in this note for the cotton and CSR criteria, supported by analysis in the Technical Background Report. As these listings are proposed to be provided in the User Manual there would be the opportunity to update them over time.

1. Cotton and other natural cellulosic seed fibres (including kapok)

(b) Production standard 2: Cotton grown according to IPM principles

Certification by the following IPM schemes shall be accepted as demonstrating

compliance – the Better Cotton Initiative (BCI), AGRO 2 (Greece), Cotton Made in

Africa and Fair Trade.

Cotton produced under the USDA IPM programme, the Australian Better Management Programme (BMP) and all programmes endorsed by the UN FAO shall additionally be required to meet the pesticide requirement in criteria 1(c).

(d) Traceability requirements applying to organic and IPM cotton

Cotton certified according to the GOTS, Fair Trade, OE Blended and OE 100

standards, as well as equivalent content claim or traceability standards shall be
accepted as complying with these requirements.
